News Slices

New software house for Apple.

Apple Inc have announced that they will be setting up a new software house to publish and market software for Apple machines.

The new company will at first be a wholly owned subsidiary of Apple Inc., but will eventually be completely independent from the main company and have its own Directors and finances.

Heyden launch new software.

At a press conference Heyden & Sons launched the much awaited Xpress into the United Kingdom DTP market.

Gunter Heyden addressed an audience of press, Apple UK personnel and User Group members and stated that the Macintosh II version was being made ready for an early launch.

Quark the publishers are actively working on Xpress add-on programmes that will make a complete editorial system for larger publishing jobs. Xpress is not cheap but it has many unique features that make it the most advanced DTP software available on the Macintosh today. More details will appear in the June issue.

Cricket Draw is now compatible with the Macintosh II and major work has been completed to enhance the performance and reliability of this unique design tool.

Cricket Software announced that they would be releasing several other new innovative products this year for both the Macintosh SE and Mac II.

NeXT to launch machine in the Autumn

Rumours from the States are that Steve Jobs will announce a new workstation in the autumn. Jobs who was the main driving force behind the original Macintosh and its closed architecture is believed to be working on a Workstation containing a 68020 and a few Transputers.

Whatever it is you can be sure that it will be powerful, innovative and not cheap. Watch this space for details in the NeXT few months.

News of what is still not available

OCTORAM ESP board speeds up the IIGS

MDIdeas of Foster City have just announced a ROM addition for their OctoRam memory expansion card which turns it into a super-fast bootable ROM disk.

Using static ram chips and 10 year battery the OctoRam is ready the instant the machine is turned on, and can load AppleWorks in 1.5 seconds. The ROM can be written to as well as read from, can be write protected, and can also be treated as a normal disk drive. Speed up ranges from 200 to 900% over disk drives.

OctoRam ESP is priced at \$179.95 with 128K on board, and can be expanded up to 512K. You should be able to get this from MGA or MacSerious soon.

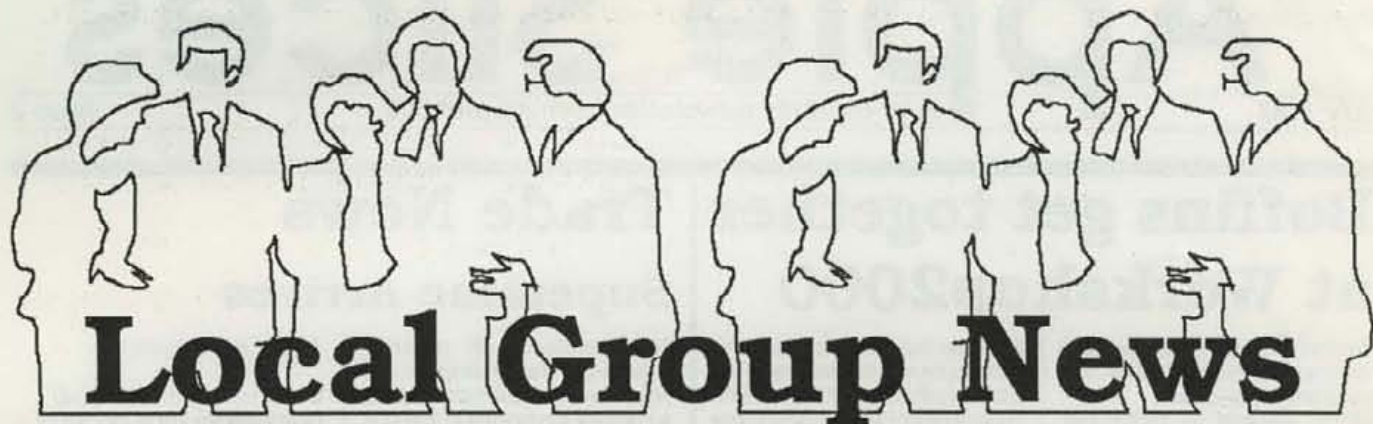

Apple Expo '87 - Paris



Apple Expo has just shut its doors at the Grande Halle de la Villette, after receiving 44,136 visitors during the 3.5 days. From 2 pm on the first day, and 10 am on the 3 subsequent days, the 170 exhibitor stands were kept exceptionally busy until 7 pm. In any case, this record attendance was foreseeable from the number of times the Apple Expo "server" had been accessed on Minitel: during September, the "server" had been used 5,332 times, and this represents a total usage time of 577 hours.

For the first time, the Department of Human Resources was present at Apple Expo in order to encourage and facilitate the contact between recruiters and potential candidates for jobs. More than 70 jobs were advertised by Apple, with over 100 applicants for jobs with Apple, Apple agents and the Apple Business School.

Amongst the record statistics mentioned above, it must also be noted that the success of the Apple "goodies" boutique (689,000 francs) shows that there is an undeniable demand for goods labelled with an apple. What's more, a whole new range of items were on display.

Finally, 11 tons of apples were munched round the Expo's alleyways during the 3.5 days.

Attendees' Comments

From Dave and Irene Flaxman

The above is a direct translation of Apple France's press release, issued immediately following the Expo. The Expo was held from Wednesday 30th September to Saturday 3rd October. We can well believe the quoted statistics - it was

an exceptionally busy event. Security was very tight, and the whole show was well-organised and ran smoothly.

The Grande Halle seems to be a converted railway station, so the French must agree with our own philosophy of converting old buildings for modern usage instead of demolishing them completely.

There were some nice "artistic" touches, too - typically French. The whole back wall of the Halle housed a stage, set with plants to give an illusion of a forest. Every half-hour, taped music could be heard, and fountains hidden amongst the foliage would be "played" to the music - the waters "dancing" to the rhythm (sometimes classical, at others jazz or popular music). Then the fashion show would start - models attired in the clothes available for purchase at the Apple boutique, dancing around the stage to the strains of pop music. I'm not sure that all the dancing would have been allowed in this country!

We were disappointed, though! The French have such a lively Apple market, that we assumed that there would be plenty of software on view which originated in Europe. This was not so, the Europeans import from the States and the UK, so there was really very little new software to be seen.

We cannot deny, however, that it was a prestigious event, and one which will obviously be repeated on an annual basis. If you decide to attend, you should ensure that you include an interpreter in your party, as it really is necessary to understand the native language. As you might expect from the French, there is no concession for foreigners - we half expected the event to be called the "Pomme Expo"!
