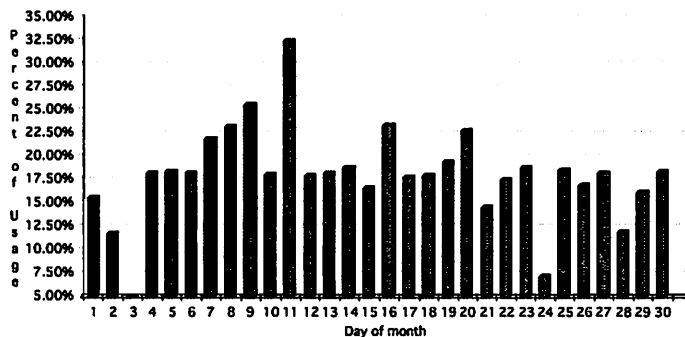

Pam Works with ClarisWorks

Taking advantage of tabs you can save time and create a document that is pleasing to the eye. Sometimes you may wish to draw a line or a number of lines to be filled in on a printed copy. If you create a document that needs lines, don't try to draw them or, worse yet, use underlining and the space bar. An easy way to have all lines end at the same place is to use a fill tab. There are two ways to create a fill tab. One way is to double-click on the tab button in the gray zone under the ruler. This opens a dialog box where you can select a fill for the tab and can also position the tab. If you have already placed a tab in the area under the ruler, simply double-click on the tab marker and the dialog box appears allowing you to make the choices.

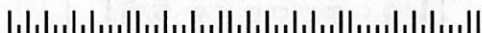

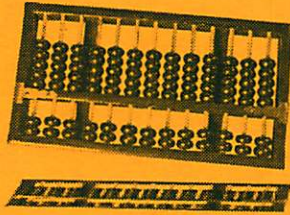
