MacOSX Tip #2 Seeing Firewire Devices

Submitted by Dave Peck

The Symptom: Using OSX, your computer has problems seeing a 3rd party Firewire hard drive or Firewire CD-RW Drive. I have a Blue & White G3 and find that this problem pops up on a semi-regular basis, especially with my Caldrive Firewire CD-RW drive. Firewire drives in general have to be supported by OSX. Verify with the manufacturer before purchase. For Firewire hard drives, the drive does should automatically mount to the desktop when your computer is started. If not, there is a problem. For Firewire CD-RW drives, when starting a program like Toast (which is used to burn CDs), you may get a message "No- CD Recorder". Or it may scan for an exceeding long time looking for a drive.

A Solution: To verify whether you have a hardware problem or a software problem, open the Apple System Profiler (located in the Application Folder/Utility Folder) and see if the device is listed. If it is not listed, then your Mac is not seeing it. While this is not a solution, it does offer a clue. I've noticed that when the "No-CD Recorder" message is there, the device will not show up in the Apple Profiler. For a Firewire hard drive- Turn the drive off and unplug it's Firewire cable. Then turn it on, wait a few moments and reconnect the Firewire cable. If all is well, the device will mount on your desktop. For a Firewire CD-RW drive- When Toast is started, it automatically scans for a CD-RW drive. If it does not find one or is not sure, it scans for a long time. If it's going to find the drive, it

usually pops up within 10 seconds. I don't like waiting for a couple of minutes, so I terminate this scanning by turning off my CD-RW drive. Immediately a No-CD-RW drive message appears. Then I simply turn the CD-RW drive back on. Another variation of this technique is to start up Toast. If the "No CD-RW drive" message is there, I turn off the Cd-RW drive, Then under the Recorder pull-down menu, I select "Recorder Info" (which initiates a scan) and immediately turn on the CD-RW drive. This seems to work most of the time. If these methods do not work, you may have something else going on with your drives. But this is a good first shot at trouble shooting.



